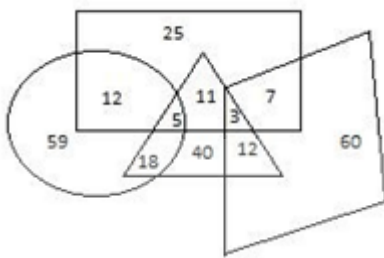

It may have been a thing that enthralled adults and children up till the 1980s, but the fascination for circus viewing has dulled over the years. Not surprising, because what was once a family's only source of entertainment, now has to compete with television, films as well as the online medium.

No wonder, the multi-coloured tents, the performing animals, Russian acrobats, flying trapezes, clowns, juggling acts, dancers and dwarfs are all. little by little, receding into oblivion from the city skylines. In urban areas, an occasional circus may appear, only to make you gaze with nostalgia. Lucknow-resident Revathy Kumar said: "As a

child, a visit to a circus when it arrived in town was the single most exciting thing in my life. The three-hour acts would remain the topic of conversation at home and among friends for days. Unfortunately, now there aren't as many circuses and there isn't enough time."

It's much the same for everyone. But if you thought circuses were still the same old performances you saw decades ago, organisers are quick to clarify. "Circuses are still more entertaining than an average Bollywood film. It's a medley of action, drama, comedy, dance and music." says Prashant S. a co-organiser of Gemini Circus, one of the best known circus companies operational in India.

With the advent of other media, though, it hasn't been easy for circuses to remain in business. Clowns, for instance, claim they have little value on another platform. "No Circus is complete without the Joker. For years, I made people laugh at my jokes. During a performance, even when I have cried, children clapped in glee. But without a circus stage to perform on, what is a clown's value," says Sudarshan, a clown with a circus company for over 15 years.

Today, increased prices (starting at Rs 30 in most cases and costing up to Rs 120 for a ring-side view) are keeping them afloat, but numbers visiting circuses are dwindling. "At one time, we remember there used to be mile long queues outside the circus tents of people waiting to buy tickets. Now, you barely see such a turnover, except in smaller cities or at rural centres. With troupe sizes measuring over 200 persons, including performers and music bands, making ends meet is increasingly tough," says Ajay T, another co-organiser of Gemmi Circus.
